The purpose of the election is to submit to the registered qualified electors of said City the question of approval or rejection of Ordinance No. 747 of the City of Blanchard relating to a one percent (1.00%) excise tax (sales tax), in addition to all present City,

County and State excise taxes, with the proceeds of said tax to be used to fund and finance road, street and bridge improvements benefits the City all as more fully set out in Ordinance No. 747 of the City of Blanchard; and containing other provisions related thereto.
